Pincushion Pattern

Supplies List

Felt

- Green (1 sheet of 9"x12"), Black (~1"x2"), White (~1"x2"), Purple* (~3"x2")

* You can make the flowers whichever color you'd like!

Embroidery Floss

- Green, Yellow, White, Black

Stuffing

Rice or Lentils

Embroidery Needle

Scissors

Supplies Tips

Use wool or wool blend felt when possible! It's much easier to work with and more durable than acrylic.

The rice or lentils are to give the pincushion some weight. You can use anything that is small but fairly heavy, that is large enough that it won't fall through your stitches, and that isn't going to rot or disintegrate!

All stitches are done with 3-strands of embroidery thread. I recommend DMC thread.

About The Pattern

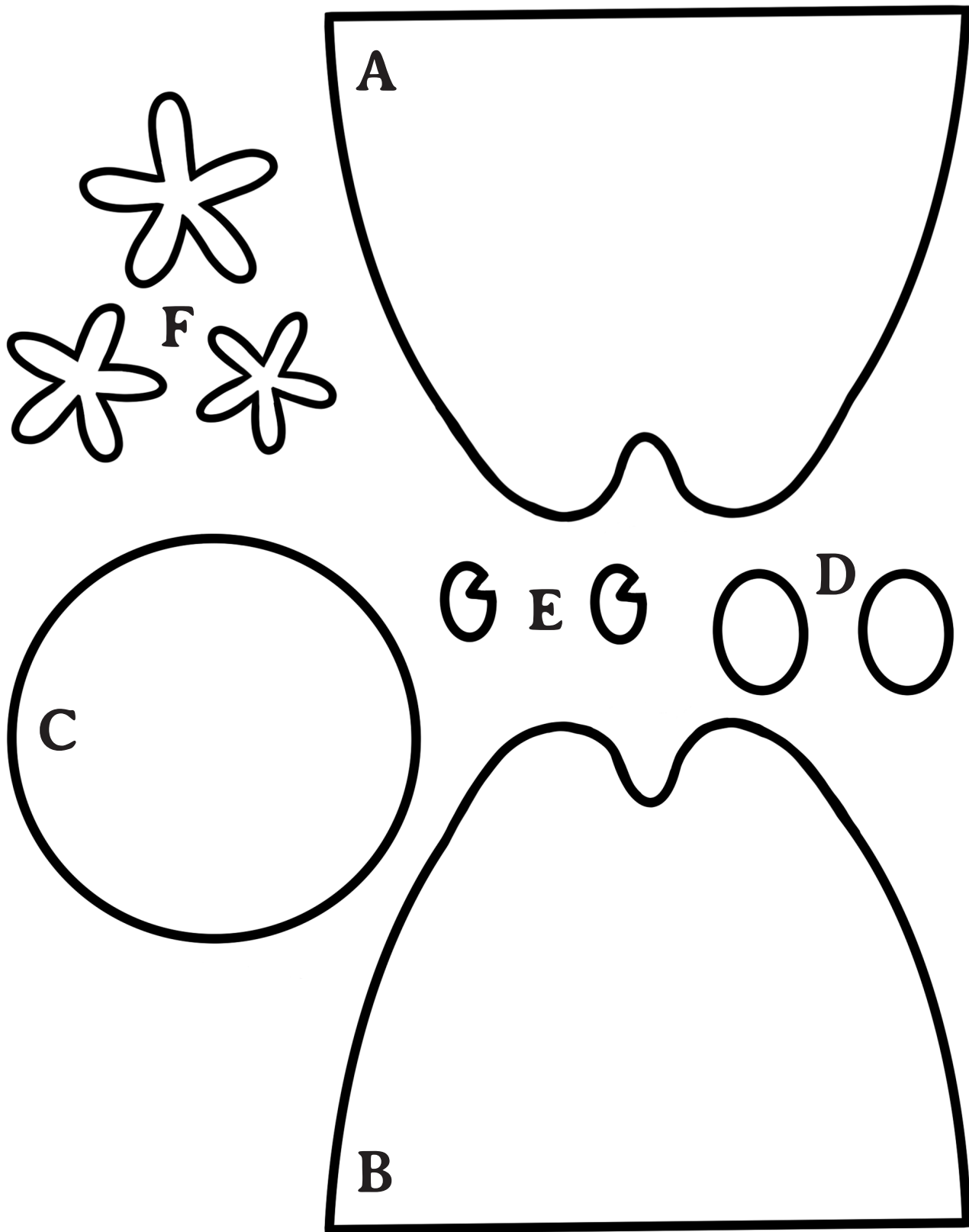
This pattern was created in November 2021 by Danielle Unett of Dano Does Things. The pincushion features a weighted bottom for stability, and measures about 4" tall, 3.5" wide, and 3" deep. Assembly Instructions

1. Follow video instructions on [Youtube.com/c/DanoDoesThings](https://www.youtube.com/c/DanoDoesThings)
2. Print and cut out all paper pattern pieces, along the outside of the black lines.
3. Use the pattern to cut the pieces of felt. Cut: A, B, C in Green. D (two pieces) in White. E (two pieces) in Black. F (three pieces) in Purple.
4. Center the iris (Piece E) on the eye (Piece D) and sew on using black embroidery thread and an applique blanket stitch. Repeat.
5. Place the eyes you just made on the top bumps of the frog face (Piece A, see front photo) using white embroidery thread and an applique blanket stitch.
6. Make a mouth under the eyes using two straight stitches (see front photo).
7. Arrange the flowers (Piece F) on the frog (Piece A) and sew together with yellow embroidery thread using three french knots per flower.
8. Line up the frog front (Piece A) and frog back (Piece B). Sew along the top edge with green embroidery thread and a blanket stitch. Do not sew the flat edges.
9. Line up the frog bottom (Piece C) along the flat edges of the frog front (Piece A) and front back (Piece B). Sew around three quarters of the circle with green embroidery thread and a blanket stitch.
10. Use the opening to put stuffing in the frog until it is almost full.
11. Push down stuffing and, using a funnel or spoon, fill the rest of the frog with rice.
12. Finish sewing the rest of the bottom circle with green embroidery thread and a blanket stitch.
